Report from the Chair – Joe Conaway

This is my last annual report as chairman of SEDAC. I have served since 2008 as a charter member of SEDAC and the last six years as Chairman, but it is now time for new leadership, but I am not going away. Sorry. I have already paid my dues for 2025 so I will take my back row seat where my mouth will no doubt get me into trouble.

I want to thank all of the past and present members of SEDAC for all their support these 16 years. The many accomplishments of SEDAC over these years would not have been possible without them. SEDAC is not a one-person operation. I would also like to thank the many folks who stopped me on the street to thank me for my columns and to tell me how much they agreed with SEDAC's positions. A very special thank you to Linda Price, member and secretary, for all that she has done for SEDAC and for me. Mr. Scott Thomas, executive director of Southern Delaware Tourism will be assuming the Chairman position in January of 2025.

We had great news in 2024 with the result of our research into the ability of Sussex County to support a medical school. Tripp Umbach, the national authority on medical education expansion has said that establishing a branch campus of an existing osteopathic medical program in Sussex County, Delaware, is needed and feasible. The question was asked and answered and SEDAC has begun the process to do just that with total cooperation from our three hospitals. Thanks once again to the eleven groups that provided the \$85,000 that were necessary for this study; they include Bayhealth, Beebe Healthcare, Tidal Healthcare, the Sussex County Council, Highmark Blue Cross Blue Shield Delaware, Carl M. Freeman Foundation, Christian and Julie Hudson Family Foundation, Chesapeake Utilities, Delaware Electric Cooperative, Fulton Bank and, of course, SEDAC. Again, we must thank Chris Weeks, Chairman, and George Beckerman, Co-chair of our committee for all their time and energy with their committee to make

this happen. We look forward to additional news releases as we move this Medical School Committee into the next step, the actual approval and construction of such a facility.

The second major initiative of SEDAC in 2024 was housing. We supported a number of pieces of legislation that dealt with the shortage of both affordable and work-force housing in Delaware. This package of legislation was just the beginning of facing the shortage of housing in Sussex. All of these bills were passed. In the meantime, SEDAC created two housing committees to address these problems, one for Affordable Housing, under the leadership of Lillian Harrison, and the second led by Preston Shell and Seth Collett for Workforce Housing. Both committees have a number of changes that will be proposed in the early part of 2025 that will make it possible for the private sector to more heavily involve themselves in these types of housing. To give you a heads up, two areas in particular will help in really solving our housing shortage and they are increased density and less costly and better thought-out government regulations.

Over the past year, SEDAC has reached out to various government agencies, taken a number of positions that, in our view will make life better in Sussex and supported our State and County elected officials when we thought that they were correct in their decisions and let them know when we thought that they were wrong. We look forward to continuing our efforts in these regards and will continue to address housing needs and improved medical opportunities in Sussex As I finished my report last year, once again I will state, please join us as we all look forward to the day when our children and grandchildren will not have long drives home during the holidays because good paying jobs that they presently hold elsewhere are available right here in Sussex County and the cost of housing close to where they work is manageable and available.

- Advocacy Committee Over the 2024 year, the advocacy committee and SEDAC increased its position as a leader in the ED world with several projects being presented to them. These presentations led to almost all being presented to the membership to vote for a letter of support issued on their behalf.

The committee is looking forward to moving forward in 2025 with new Transportation Secretary Shante Hastings (Deputy Director in 2024) who the committee has already established a working relationship with
